Director's Note Ahnya Chang

Musical Theatre is a constantly changing entity, and it can be hard to keep up. Like any aspect of our cultural landscape, it is as influential (and susceptible) to trends as fashion, cinema, popular music, literature, and language. Compositional style and dramaturgical approach is developed, celebrated, then antiquated, again and again, and audiences can be fickle. We are not an easily satisfied public, and the art and industry

respond accordingly to keep us in the room, keep us engaged, keep us occupied and invested. It can be difficult to know where we stand.

In this type of climate, it's important to keep two things in mind. Where did we come from--how did this all begin--and then, what endures, and why? Our roots and foundation tell us everything about why things are and where they could go. The longevity and ongoing relevance of some things over others tell us what we value as a culture and as a species. Gypsy is one of the best demonstrations of what American Musical Theatre in particular is about. It boasts the pedigree, structure, themes, characters, and glorious music to stand at the top of the output of Broadway's Golden Age, and as one of the most frequently-revived shows in Broadway history, no one can deny the hold that it has on our yearning for a meaningful theatrical experience.

Written by Arthur Laurents and composed by Jule Styne, with lyrics by a 29 year-old Stephen Sondheim, it was meant to be a starring vehicle for Ethel Merman. Merman, and the show's producers, identified the memoirs of striptease artist Gypsy Rose Lee as a perfect project for a Broadway legend--it was full of scenery-chewing dialogue and broadly-written characters to play opposite Merman's explosive style. But what could have merely been a well-supported vanity project has proven to be more of a love letter to theatre as a whole. It itself acknowledges its roots and the things that last. Everything we see on stage today, from Broadway to Branson to Vegas, comes from dusty fly rails and burlesque houses, from wooden floors and dark backstage corridors, from bawdy comics and the beginnings of American song. It comes from the often thankless work of people who create routines and shows from little seeds of ideas, and develop them in alleyways and run-down hotels. Much of that work disappears without record. What stays is the best of the showmanship, the storytelling, and the ineffable spark of truly great artists.

In this piece, the writers also provided us with a story--a fable, they call it--about purpose, intention, dreams, and relationships. There is no character in this show with whom we cannot recognize a shared feeling or experience. We see how each of them hopes, how they think, how they love, and what they lose. There is sympathy for all of them, a way to see their differing perspectives, providing us with an opportunity to examine how we see people around us outside of the theatre. What pushes people

to seek out what they want? What are the things that hold people back? Why does intention sometimes feel confusing, and can we reconcile our experience and feelings in a way that we can at last move forward together with the people we love? This story can confront us in many beautiful--though perhaps uncomfortable--ways, and they're all as relatable now as they were in 1959. They always will be.

Foundation and longevity are what we consider here. Mr. Bright was a director and educator who prized multi-dimensional and empathetic storytelling, and challenged people to create truly heartfelt characters with deep-seated emotion and purpose. That is what theatre is built on, and why it will live forever. He taught consideration, and discipline, and complex communication through dialogue and movement and song, entreating his actors and musicians to inspire thought and feeling in their audience. These are the things that will always be important—in performance as storytelling tools, and in the development of artists—and are the roots of his legacy. The Bright Foundation holds these ideas close to their heart. Care for your craft, know where you came from, and identify the things that endure. Through this incredible material, surrounded by this incomparable music, we have the opportunity to be beautifully reminded of the things that were important to him, and of the things that make Theatre great to all of us.

Congratulations to the brightest kids on the planet.

She also starred as Donna Sheridan in the Broadway musical "Mamma Mia!" 2005-2009, and the Las Vegas Review-Journal in 2005 named her the "Most Talented Female Entertainer of Las Vegas." Jacquelyn's dynamic career spans an impressive range of productions, from originating the lead role of Jocelyn in the world premiere of "Sudoku The Musical" to delivering comedic brilliance as Carolyn in "Divorce Party." She starred alongside Rick Springfield in "EFX" at MGM Grand, headlined "Tease" at the Blue Note Jazz Club and was a featured singer for Wayne Newton including on his first USO Tour post 9/11.

Her star power extends beyond the stage having performed with icons including Ruth Pointer, Cindy Williams, Neil McCoy, Jessica Simpson, Shaggy, Jennifer Hudson and Rob Schneider.

She trained at Punahou School and continued in Pittsburgh, New York, and New Delhi, where she studied Kathak dance under the disciples of Pandit Birju Maharaj. She was a teaching artist and assistant to Jacques D'Amboise at the National Dance Institute. Local stage appearances include productions with Hawaii Ballet Theatre, Diamond Head Theatre, Manoa Valley Theatre, and Legends in Concert Hawaii. On Oahu: Director - To Kill a Mockingbird, Camelot, Calendar Girls, Love, Loss, and What I Wore, Steel Magnolias (DHT), and Avenue Q (MVT). Choreographer — Waitress and My Fair Lady (DHT). She is on the faculty of Hawaii Ballet Theatre and `lolani School.


